Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in our school;
- helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- identifies the children with the school;
- supports our commitment to inclusion;
- prevents children from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class;
- is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind;
- is considered good value for money by most parents.

Expectations

We expect all pupils to comply with this uniform policy and will be regularly monitored. Where uniform does not meet the agreed requirements, pupils and/or parents/carers will be advised of this accordingly by their class teacher. An agreed timescale will be given for uniform to be rectified. Continued failure to comply will be brought to the attention of the Phase Leader and/or the Head of School.

The Role of Parents/Carers

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items.

The Role of Governors

The governing body supports the Head of School and Executive Headteacher in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It considers all representations from parents/carers regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Head of School/Executive Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school Uniform Policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

Headscarves/Hijab

These may be worn for religious reasons but must be in school colours – black; white or green.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in school. The exceptions to this rule are: ear-ring studs in pierced ears; small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain or Sikh Kara.

Hairstyles

Hairstyles should be appropriate for school, i.e. no 'Mohicans', no designs cut into hair, no extremely short hair (no-guard or number 1) or bright coloured highlights. All long hair (shoulder length or

longer) should be tied back. Headbands or hair bobbles should be plain black; white or green (Christ Church); black; white or purple (Lark Hill) and black; white or navy blue (Lewis Street).

School Bags

There is no reason for children to bring large bags into school. There is a great shortage of space in the cloakrooms and large bags exacerbate the problem. Children will need a reading book bag. These can be purchased from the school office. Children will need a PE bag which should remain in school. Children on packed lunches should have a packed lunch box, storage for which are provided in school. Children are encouraged to bring a water bottle into school which is clearly labelled with their name.

Recycling

We encourage all families to recycle uniform where possible. Lost property is stored in school and at the end of the school year, if items of uniform are not collected, items are either sent to a local recycling centre or available to families free of charge. We want to help families to save money by buying less school uniform every year, and raise awareness about how recycling clothes can help the environment.

Equality Impact Assessment

As a school community we are committed to promoting equality. Therefore, an equality impact assessment has been undertaken and we believe this policy is in line with the Equality Act 2010 as it is fair, it does not prioritise or disadvantage any pupil and it helps to promote equality at this school.

Monitoring and Review

The governing body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy through its committee work by: seeking the views of parents/carers, to ensure that they agree with and support the policy; considering, with the Head of School and/or Executive Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform.

Appendix 1 – Christ Church CE Primary

We have high expectations for uniform at Christ Church C.E. We pride ourselves on how smart our children look and we thank you for your support in this. Please see below our expectations for uniform.

<p>Boys</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grey or black trousers or shorts • White polo shirt • Bottle green jumper or school sweatshirt • Black shoes or black trainers (no logos or boots) • Grey or black plain socks • Boys are permitted to wear small stud earrings only. Hooped earrings are not permitted. 	
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<p>Girls</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grey or black skirt, pinafore or trousers • White polo shirt • Bottle green jumper, school sweatshirt or cardigan • White or grey socks • Grey or black tights • Dark plain hair accessories, hair must be tied up. No large bows, flowers or large hair bands. • Black shoes or black trainers (no logos or boots) • Green and white gingham Summer dress • Girls are permitted to wear small stud earrings only. Hooped earrings are not permitted. 	
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<p>Shoes</p> <p>Children are permitted to wear plain black school shoes or trainers. Trainers must be fully black, no white soles or logos permitted.</p>

<p>PE</p> <p>Girls and Boys:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plain black shorts or plain black tracksuit bottoms, no logos • Plain white T-shirt or polo top, no logos or motifs • Bottle green jumper or school sweatshirt • Plain black pumps or plain black trainers <p>Children who do not have the correct PE kit will be provided with a spare kit to wear.</p>	
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<p>Book Bags</p> <p>All children need to bring a book bag to school on a daily basis. These can be purchased from Touchline.co.uk.</p> <p>Children do not need pencil cases as everything is provided by school.</p> <p>Rucksacks are not permitted in school due to the limited space in cloakrooms.</p>	<p>Infant book bag (Nursery-Y2)</p>  <p>Junior Bookbag (Y3-Y6)*</p>  <p>*Optional version for KS2. Children can still use the infant version if previously purchased.</p>
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Please ensure your child's name is clearly labelled on all items of clothing. Uniform bearing the school logo can be bought from Touchline.co.uk (please see the link below). Uniform without a logo is available from many large supermarkets. Sports brands are not permitted. You will be contacted by your child's class teacher if your child does not have the correct uniform.
