# Following Jesus Example Serving others

#### **Bible verses**

"Then the King will say ..., 'Come. My Father has given you his blessing... I was hungry, and you gave me food. I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink. I was alone and away from home, and you invited me into your house. I was without clothes, and you gave me something to wear. I was sick, and you cared for me. I was in prison, and you visited me. "... The...people will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and give you food? ... thirsty and give you something to drink? ... alone and away from home and invite you into our house? ....without clothes and give you something to wear? ... see sick or in prison and care for you?" "Then the King will answer, 'I tell you the truth. Anything you did for any of my people here, you also did for me'.

## **Creative Prayer 1≈ Footstep Prayer Trail**

This is something to do with other people in the household. One of the ways we can follow Jesus example is by serving others. We might not always be able to do the things in the reading but there are lots of different way we can serve others by being kind to them or including them in things we do—we can also serve them by praying for them. Cut a number of footsteps shapes out of some paper Write something to pray about on each one like asking God to help you find ways to serve others; the name of someone you want to pray for; thanking God for someone who serves you; praying for people who might be far away from home or have no home; praying for those who have little or no food in this country an other parts of the world; people who are ill—you could each do a few of them. Find a space inside or out doors and lay them out. Take it in turns to go along the trail you have made, stopping at each footstep and praying for the thing that is on there.

## **Creative Prayer 2 ≈ Prayer finger labyrinth**

Create a prayer finger labyrinth by drawing one, sticking foil on paper, painting, Lego, anything you can think of really! Use your finger to slowly make your way through the labyrinth. Think about these things as you go; How is life like a journey? Who serves you on your journey? How do they serve you? How do you see God travel with you? Talk to God about these things. Thank him that he is with you. You might like to talk about these things with other people too.


