Dear Parent /Carer

Bubble suspension due to a positive case.

Unfortunately, we are having to suspend the bubble which your child is in. The reason for this is that a member of your child's bubble has tested positive for Covid-19.

We need your child to self-isolate **until Wednesday 28th October**. Isolation means your child cannot go outside of the house (unless in your garden) other family members (outside your household) cannot visit and the child cannot see friends. Other members living with the child do not need to isolate unless the child develops symptoms. If your child or anyone else in the household feels unwell please call 0800 925 1000 and we will arrange testing. **WE DO NOT TEST UNLESS A PERSON HAS SYMPTOMS.**

All of the bubble has been sent home for the next 5 days, meaning they can return to school after half term on **Monday 2nd November**.

It is important that we are all aware of the symptoms of Covid-19 and only well children attend school.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of any of the following:

A new continuous cough

A high temperature (fever)

A loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

Any one of the above symptoms gives reason for high level of suspicion for COVID-19.

A well person or child: feels 100% well, seems themselves and not displaying any changes in behaviour or their daily routines.

An unwell person or child could be a possible case of COVID-19.

A combination of symptoms below gives reason for high level of suspicion for COVID-19.

Vomiting/nausea/off their food, diarrhoea, sleeping more than usual, complaining of not feeling themselves, listless/restless/agitated, shortness of breath, feeling cold, headache, severe body aches, sore throat, congested or runny nose, skin rash - anything that is not feeling themselves.

Note: For fevers, the NHS advice is to look for a high temperature – 'this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back; you do not need to measure your temperature'.

For most people Covid19 is a mild illness, if you or your child develops any of the above symptoms or becomes unwell, please contact NHS111 or your GP. Although Covid19 is circulating in the community, usual childhood illnesses are too and it is important that these are not missed. We are asking everyone who is unwell with any two of the above symptoms to book a test by ringing **0800 952 1000**
